Zerolatum Emollient Bath Additive. *Product name:* Zerolatum Emollient Bath Additive. *Ingredients:* Liquid Paraffin, Acetylated Wool Alcohols, Isopropyl Myristate, Macrogol Lauryl Ether 3 (C12-C13 parath-3). *Indications:* Bath treatment for the relief of contact dermatitis, eczema, senile pruritus, ichthyosis & related dry skin disorders. *Adverse reactions:* Occasionally, contact sensitivity reactions may occur in patients sensitised to one or more of the constituents e.g. to acetylated wool alcohols. This may cause mild skin irritation. *Precautions:* Take care not to slip in the bath or shower. There are no known incompatibilities. Use during pregnancy or breastfeeding is unlikely to have any ill effects when used as directed. If unsure, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. *Contraindications:* Hypersensitivity to any of the ingredients. *Method of administration:* *Adults:* Add 15-20ml to a standard bath of warm water (8 inches deep). Immerse and cover the affected areas with the bath water and soak for 10-20 minutes. Pat dry with a towel. *Infants and Children:* Add 10ml to a small bath or wash basin of warm water. Immerse and cover the affected areas with the bath water and soak for 10-20 minutes. Alternatively, gently sponge over the affected areas repeatedly. Zeroneum Emollient Bath Additive. *Product name:* Zeroneum Emollient Bath Additive. *Ingredients:* Refined Soya bean oil, Macrogol lauryl ether (Laureth-4), Oleic acid diethanolamide, Butylated hydroxytoluene (E321), Propylene glycol, Perfume. *Indications:* Bath treatment for the relief of contact dermatitis, eczema and related dry skin conditions in adults and children. *Adverse reactions:* Occasionally, contact sensitivity reactions may occur, e.g. mild skin reactions. If accidentally spilled in the eyes before dilution the product may cause irritation. *Precautions:* For external use only. This product contains propylene glycol and butylated hydroxytoluene which may cause local skin reactions (e.g. contact dermatitis) or skin irritation. Zeroneum contains soya bean oil. If you are allergic to peanut or soya do not use this product. Avoid contact of the undiluted product with the eyes and skin. Zerobase cream is used for the symptomatic treatment of red inflamed, dry or chapped skin, the protection of raw skin areas and as a pre-bathing emollient for dry/eczematous skin to alleviate dry areas. *Adverse reactions:* Rarely, mild reactions such as skin rash can occur. *Precautions:* For external use only. Zerobase contains cetostearyl alcohol and chlorocresol which may cause local skin reaction (e.g. contact dermatitis) or allergic reactions. Avoid contact with the eyes. Talk to your doctor before use if the skin is broken, badly cracked, infected or bleeding. There are no known incompatibilities. Zerocream Emollient. *Product name:* Zerocream Emollient. *Ingredients:* Liquid Paraffin, White Soft Paraffin, Lanolin Anhydrous (wool fat), Glycerol Monostearate, Cetyl Alcohol, Sodium Cetostearyl sulphate, Citric Acid Monohydrate (E330), Carbomer, Purified Water, Sodium Hydroxide, Sodium Methyl Hydroxybenzoate, Sodium Propyl Hydroxybenzoate. *Indications:* Zerocream is an emollient used for the symptomatic treatment of flaking, dry skin, ichthyosis, traumatic dermatitis, sunburn, the dry stage of eczema and certain dry cases of psoriasis. *Adverse reactions:* Rarely, mild allergic reactions such as a skin rash can occur. *Precautions:* For external use only. Zerocream contains methyl and propyl hydroxybenzoates, cetyl alcohol and lanolin which may cause local skin reactions (e.g. contact dermatitis) or allergic reactions which may not appear immediately. Contains cetostearyl alcohol which may cause local skin reactions (e.g. contact dermatitis). Avoid contact with the eyes. Talk to your doctor before use if the skin is broken, badly cracked, infected or bleeding. Baths and showers may become slippery when used. There are no known incompatibilities. Use during pregnancy and breastfeeding is unlikely to have any ill effects when used as directed. Also used as a pre-bathing emollient for dry skin, to alleviate drying effects. *Adverse reactions:* Rarely, mild allergic reactions such as a skin rash can occur. *Precautions:* For external use only. Zeroguent contains soya bean oil. If you are allergic to peanut or soya do not use this product. This product contains cetostearyl alcohol, propylene glycol and sorbic acid which may cause local skin reactions (e.g. contact dermatitis) or skin irritation. Avoid contact with the eyes. Do not use if tube seal is broken or appears tampered with at first use. Children under 1 year should be treated under medical supervision. Allergic reactions on extremely sensitive skin. *Precautions:* For external use only. Avoid contact with the eyes. If you notice this or any other side effect, stop use and tell your doctor or pharmacist. *Precautions:* For external use only. Do not use if tear-lab is broken or appears tampered with at first use.
